Alice Emma McNutt Crow passed away peacefully in her sleep on Saturday, December 28 after nearly 99 years. She was born in Hanceville, Alabama to Edith and Jim McNutt and was the oldest of seven children. After graduating from high school in Hanceville, she attended and graduated from Judson College where she was a music major. After Judson, she started teaching school in Calera, Alabama before moving to Fort Payne where she taught until her retirement. She married J.O.
