Alison Anne Dent, age 83, of Huntsville, passed away on May 29, 2013, at Dekalb Regional Medical Center. Mrs. Dent was born on August 19, 1929, in Chingford, Essex, England, to the late William Stanley Mazengarb Wood and Grace Helen Haylock Wood. She was a member of the Episcopal Church and was a homemaker.

Alison grew up and lived in with her family in Woodford Green, England, and after her marriage moved with her husband and daughter to Huntsville, Alabama, where her husband became an engineer on the Apollo projects. She later lived in New Orleans, Louisiana, and San Diego, California, before eventually returning to Huntsville, the city that she most loved. Most recently Alison spent several years in assisted living in Hazel Green, until moving this spring to South Hampton Nursing & Rehab in Owens Crossroads.
