Clark W. McClain, better known as “Mac”, age 95 of Collinsville passed away Monday, August 11, 2008 in Gadsden Regional Medical Center. He and his family owned and operated C.W. McClain Wrecker Service. He served in the U.S. Army during WWII in the southern Phillipines for 5 years, 3 months, and 21 days. He was a member of the Van Buren Masonic Lodge #355 F & AM, the Alabama Towing and Recovery Association, a retired Fire Chief of Collinsville and a retired member of the Collinsville Rescue Squad. He was preceded in death by his wife of over 64 years Mildred “Mit” McClain in June 2008. Funeral services will be 3 p.m Thursday, August 14, 2008 at the Harvest Community Center Church in Collinsville with Bro. James Adkins and Bro. Edward Matthews officiating. He will lie instate at the church from 2 until 3 p.m. on Thursday. Burial will follow in Collinsville Cemetery with full Masonic and Military rites. The family will receive friends Wednesday from 5 until 8 at the funeral home.
