Mary Helen Burt Massey, age 90, of Fort Payne, passed away Sunday, January 4, 2026, at Crowne Health.

Helen was born March 10, 1935, on Lookout Mountain in the Dogtown community to James Elijah and Gencie (Casey) Burt. She married Elvin Massey Sunday, January 4, 1953.

When her daughters were ages five and nine, she led them with a honeyed alto voice as The Massey Trio; Martha Hughes Gilbreath was their first pianist. Approximately 12 years later she sang with Floyd Whaley, Don Reeves, her sister-in-law, Wanda Burt with pianist Gail Reeves Garrett as the Ruhama Quartet. Sometime later she sang with Milford Cushen, Larry, and Jeff Bruce with pianist Teresa Peyton as the Ambassador's Quartet.

She was known for her hard work and undeniable joy of tending to her beautiful flower gardens and flower lined paths. Helen will be lovingly remembered for her elaborate Christmas Villages, decorating stylish Christmas trees, making custom made draperies, her made from scratch apple and pecan pies, delicious old fashioned iron skillet fudge and her love of all animals. Helen rescued many stray cats and made sure they were neutered and spayed, well fed and loved.

Helen was preceded in death by her husband of 62 years, Elvin Massey; her brothers, J.R. (Russell), Donald, Ralph, and Kenneth Burt. She is survived by her daughters, Anita Massey and Renea Massey-Kusma, her sister Patricia Jones, many beloved nieces and nephews and their children including Talia Parker and Tucker and Hudson Jones; her sisters-in-law, Trillis (James) Moses and Betty Massey and lifelong friend, Stephanie Graham. She leaves behind the animals she loved more than life, eight cats and Gus the dog.

All Spring and Summer Mother would cheerfully be outside at 7 a.m. pulling weeds, setting out the plants she thought she'd hidden from Dad the day before, and fully enjoying herself for two solid hours in the yard. By 9 a.m. Dad had coaxed her inside to dress for breakfast at the Waffle King. By Noon she was settled at her favorite sewing shop at the Potter's house in Dogtown.

She would sew, hammer a valance together, have a coffee break for sure, and possibly hang a job with Dad's assistance before heading back home by late afternoon for more yard work. After dinner she would often head to Wilson Funeral Home to vacuum, dust and all the rest when the families had gone home for the evening.

Mother loved it when her "girls" were visiting in general, but also loved that we pitched in with the funeral home cleaning detail. Elvin was more comfortable supervising, as I recall.

Mother loved the family she grew up with, and the little family she and Dad nurtured for their entire lives when their daughters were born. Mother freely said, "I love you," and enjoyed hearing it so much.

It was heartwarming how frequently she heard it, and said it, to so many at Crowne Health and Rehabilitation. She heard it from caring women in administration, (one in particular that she adored). She heard it from her favorite visitors from housekeeping, laundry, and foodservice throughout the day, and from the dedicated CNA's, LPN's and RN's. Her CNA's became her adopted daughters. Mother was also quite fond of the Physical Therapists. It represented work and progress to her, and as she said, "I like walking down the hall with a handsome man." God bless you, Mother. You were a pistol.
