



## Jadell Collins Anderson

January 4, 1918 - October 10, 2013

Jadell C. Anderson, age 95, passed from this life on Thursday, October 10, 2013 in Abilene, Texas. A family visitation will be held Friday, October 11 from 6:00 to 7:30 at Piersall Funeral Directors at 733 Butternut. A second visitation will be held on Sunday, October 13 at the Wilson Funeral Home in Ft. Payne, Alabama from 1:30 to 3:00.
