When My Daddy moved us to Michigan in 1953, I was 10 & she 11 yrs. old. We would write Post cards, (that only cost us a penny to mail! I wish I had kept them!) missing those fun times together! When my parents retired & moved back to AL. They bought Jewell's Mother Inlaws little house next door to Jewell & Kenneth. So we saw each other a lot then. One by one my 3 sister's & I followed our parent's back to AL. So Jewell, Kenneth, my husband & I would spend every Friday evening together. We LOVED going out to eat &
