“ Mr. Steven Kean, you have my heartfelt sympathy in the death of your father. When I saw your father's obituary, I knew he had to be related to me. My name is Peggy Lankford Bailey and I live in Fort Payne, My mother was Lillie Mae Kean Lankford, her father was George Washington Kean, his father was Elkaney Delaney Kean, and his father was Solomon Kean. I was able to trace your father's ancestry as follows: John Leonard Franklin, Jr.'s father was John Leonard Kean, Sr., his father was William Carothers Kean (buried at Little Sulphur Springs Cemetery, Fort Payne, Dekalb, Al USA), and his father was Solomon Kean. I was able to verify this info through Censuses on Ancestry.com. You may already have this information. I am guessing that your father never returned to Alabama after his stint in the Navy but I have been unable to verify his whereabouts after 1946.
