Patricia Ann "Pat" Brown, of Madison, Alabama, formerly of Fort Payne passed away Friday, March 12, 2010. She was born to Milford and Jessica Igou on October 27, 1942 in Fort Payne, Alabama. She graduated from the University of Alabama with a Bachelors of Science degree in mathematics and later began a long and successful career in the computer graphics industry where she became the first female Executive Manager at Intergraph Corporation. As a resident of Madison for over thirty years, she was an original member of the Madison Street Fair committee and was instrumental in launching the event which is in its 30th year. Among her interests, Pat especially enjoyed gardening, her pets, and collecting antiques. In later years she retired for health reasons and dedicated her remaining years to her son Jeff Brown, in his plumbing business, and the joys of her family: her Jeff and wife Chaun, and her six grandchildren Scott, Jessica, Blake, Chris, Mac, and Maya. She is also survived by her brother and sister-in-law, Jim and Bonnie Igou of Athen, nieces, nephews, and close family friends.
