Peggy Joyner Satterlee, beloved wife and mother, died Saturday, August 25, 2012 at her daughter's home in Mentone, Alabama at the age of 87. Mrs. Satterlee, a retired school teacher and guidance counselor, was born in New Orleans, LA., and lived in Diamondhead, MS for the past 31 years. She graduated from McDonogh High School, received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in History from Newcomb College, and a Master of Arts Degree in Education from Loyola University. Mrs. Satterlee taught history at Colton Middle School and also taught dancing. She was a guidance counselor at Carr High School and Francis W. Gregory Junior High School. She is survived by her husband, Clifford Thomas Satterlee; sister, Patricia Joyner Bermingham; daughter, Elizabeth Satterlee Stephens; son-in-law, Jerome Bouck Stephens, two grandchildren, Romey Elizabeth Atchley (David Atchley) and Justin Thomas Stephens (Agnieszka Rewilak Stephens); three great grandchildren, August Sky Atchley, Sophie Elizabeth Stephens and Ryder Thomas Stephens. She was married to Clifford Satterlee for 65 years. She was an ardent bridge player and loved playing bridge with her many friends in Diamondhead. A memorial mass will be held at a later date.
