



William "Bill" H. Mattox

September 17, 1922 - October 24, 2014

William H. "Bill" Mattox, 92, of Fort Payne died Friday, October 24, 2014 at his residence. He was born in Ridgetop, TN on September 17, 1922, one of 11 children of John B. Mattox Sr. and Una Hildebrand Mattox. He lived for several years in Florence, AL until he started high school, then graduated from Lawrenceburg Tennessee High School in 1941. He worked in Washington, DC just out of high school and then the Army Signal Corps in October 1942. He served as a S/Sgt. in New Guinea and the Philippines and was discharged from the Army in Jan. 1946. Bill married Jacqueline Sterling in Fort Payne, AL in 1947 and graduated from Cumberland Law School in Lebanon, TN in 1948. He worked with his father-in-law, A.M. Sterling, in the automobile and tractor business for several years and then spent 35 years in Fort Payne in the gasoline and oil business. He spent 9 years on the Fort Payne City School Board and was in several other civic clubs. Bill was a member of First Baptist Church of Fort Payne for over 50 years.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Jackie Mattox.

He is survived by his son, Gary Sterling Mattox of Fort Payne ; a special friend, Carolyn Hicks, of Fort Payne; and sister, Annabelle D'Aprix of Ojai, CA.

Funeral services will be 11 a.m. Monday at Wilson Funeral Home Chapel with Dr. Pat McFadden officiating. Burial will follow in Glenwood Cemetery. The

family will receive friends Sunday from 4 until 7 p.m. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to First Baptist Church or the American Cancer Society.
