William "David" Vincent, age 72 of Fort Payne, passed away Friday, April 16, 2021 at his home surrounded by family.

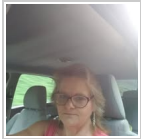

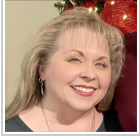
